

The God of All Comfort Has, and Will Continue to, Deliver You

<u>2 Corinthians 13:3-5:</u> "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ."

Perhaps you have just experienced a season of trouble, perhaps you are now entering into a trying time, in which you need extra comfort. The word for comfort in this letter to the Corinthian Church (paraklesis in the Greek) has the idea of strengthening, of making strong and brave.

- In these verses, we know God the Father as our Comforter, our Paraclete.
- We also know Jesus as our Comforter (<u>2 Thessalonians 2:16-17</u>, <u>1 Peter 5:7</u>)
- And we know the Holy Spirit as our Helper and Comforter (John 14:16, 14:26, 15:26, 16:7).

God, in every aspect of His being, is full of comfort, help and strength for us.

There are troubles ahead, we cannot predict. There are troubles of the past of which we are often reminded. There are present troubles. Trials, trouble and suffering are guaranteed in the life of the Christian (John 16:33, Acts 14:22, Philippians 1:29, Romans 5:3). Yet, we are also promised comfort in the mist of these seasons, through Christ. And, having been comforted by God, we can comfort others.

Celebrating Easter, we recognize that God has delivered us.

- We know the power and love of God (John 3:16).
- We know the hope and truth of Jesus' resurrection (<u>1 Peter 1:3</u>).
 We know what it cost Him (<u>1 Peter 3:18)</u>.
- We know the freedom from the sin's penalty, which Christ absorbed for us (<u>2 Corinthians 5:21</u>).

So too, in times of trials, we should remind ourselves of our God of all comfort, who will give us strength and will continue to deliver us. <u>2 Corinthians 13:10:</u> "He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and He will deliver us again. On Him we have set our hope that He will continue to deliver us...

God works in and for us in the past, present and future. You have been saved. You are now saved.

- As we age, our God will not forsake us.
- As the world continues to descend into darkness, to flaunt and celebrate sin, He will never leave us.
- When we wonder how we will endure, He who has delivered us and does deliver us will continue to deliver us.

We trust in Him. He is our strength and our comfort, our hope and our deliverance. We praise Him for the mercies of the past, in our daily life today and of the future. We look forward to the future, to eternity, spent with Him.

Psalm 46:1: God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

May you know Him as your refuge and strength, your help and deliverer, now and always.

The Noble Acolyte 101: Did you know that anyone can be an Acolyte? It doesn't *need to be* a middle school student, but can be a responsible, tall enough, younger child carrying the "firestick" or open to *any age* that would like to serve in this way! Kudos to Barb Hunley for volunteering! In keeping with tradition, the nuance of acolyting is this:

Arrive 10 minutes early before the service begins, ask the person at the AV desk to light the candlelighter, and walk slowly toward the altar so the flame doesn't go out. Pause before the middle of the altar before lighting (looking up at the cross or offering a small prayer to bless the worship is good here), then FIRST light the Epistle Candle on the left (by the music stands), then the Gospel Candle to the right (next to the pulpit/lectern). While still facing the candles, pause and gently blow out the candlelighter, turn around, and depart down the center aisle returning the lighter to its stand in the back.

At the end of worship during the singing of the Closing Hymn, retrieve the unlit candlelighter and go forward to the altar again to do the opposite. First light the candlelighter from the Gospel Candle (Light of Christ) then snuff out that candle. Next, snuff out the Epistle Candle then SLOWLY exit down the center aisle symbolizing that you are taking **The Light of Christ** out into the world! Once you reach the back, blow out the candlelighter and return to the stand. That's it! Let Barb Nimke know if you would like to acolyte, and she'll get you on the worship schedule – *thanks*!
