# To the beloved, called, and kept of God!

These tender words from the Letter of Jude convey God's heart for you, and my prayers for all of you as well. They are true words, because they are God's Word over us as His people. They enliven us every time we gather for worship.

**You are beloved** – dearly loved and treasured by God. God who has proven His love for you in this, that while we were dead because of sin, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8). The words spoken over us every week after the confession of sins: "In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for you, and for his sake, God forgives you all your sins" convey the love of God. It is God who is rich in mercy because of the great love with which He loved us that He made us alive in Christ (Ephesians 2:4-5). In this is love: not that we loved God but that He loved us (1 John 4:10).

**You are called** – chosen, invited (as to a banquet), set apart for salvation in Christ. The Holy Spirit calls us through the Gospel, empowers us with His gifts, sets us apart and preserves us in the true faith.<sup>1</sup> You are called, not arbitrarily, but intentionally, chosen in Him before the foundation of the world (Ephesians 1:4). He is the One who has set us apart entirely for Himself – spirit, soul, and body – to be blameless at the coming of Jesus. Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass (1 Thessalonians 5:23-24). Every Sunday as we gather we are responding to the Spirit's call: we have been chosen to come, to gather, to worship, to pray, to receive the Word: proclaimed and in the bread and cup.

**You are kept** – as a shepherd keeps his sheep (tends, feeds, sleeps with, defends, and loves) so, God the great shepherd keeps you, His flock for Himself. We are His people and the sheep of His pasture (Psalm 100:3). For He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, the sheep of His hand (Psalm 95:7). And as our Good Shepherd, Jesus lays down His life for us (John 10:11). We are reminded of being His sheep, His kept ones at the end of every worship service as the blessing of God is spoken over us: "The LORD bless you and keep you..." (Numbers 6:24).

None of these truths initiated with us. In other words, His love, His call, and His choice to keep us for His own, all start and end with God. He is the author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). Our weekly gathering bestows on us our identity in Christ as the beloved, called, and kept of God. As the Spirit wills and works faith in to our lives through the Gospel, we are transformed again and again, from glory to glory to live from that identity for the sake of others.

The fruit of such Holy Spirit transformation sends us *with* Jesus to show God's love, call, and care for others. Being first loved by God, we do not wait to love others. Called by God we are generous in our inviting others into our lives. Kept by the Good Shepherd, we are sensitive to the needs of others and quick to extend care for them, even to laying down our lives.

As Jude continues with his greeting, "To those who are the called, beloved in God the Father, and kept for Jesus Christ: May mercy and peace and love be multiplied to you..."

## **Kitchen Remodel!**

It was incredible to watch our kitchen remodel come together like clockwork each day. Fellowship Team got the ball rolling by sorting and clearing out the kitchen over several Fridays during Mar & Apr. On Sunday, Apr 21, the PLC DemoBros took the lead and removed every bit of the old kitchen and loaded up the trailer to haul it all away in about an hour!

A crew from Parker Electric arrived Monday, ran lines and installed the new canister lights. We took cabinet delivery on Tue which filled half the fellowship hall! Soren, with Compass Construction, was with us Wed-Fri to complete all the drywall work (great job!). On Apr 29-30 the painter completed the kitchen and hallway – thank you Felipe! At the same time, the old tile floor was chipped up and the area cleaned for cabinet installation the next day.



Travis arrived and began to unbox cabinets then began installing everything like a giant jigsaw puzzle over the next three days of May 1-3. Chris, a plumber from Thomas Bros., popped in during this time to cut and cap pipe work for easier cabinet installation along the back wall. During the torch cutting and soldering, which created some heat and smoke, the alarm system went off so there was a

little excitement in our day! After the lower cabinet was in, the pipe was restored the same day, and water lines checked. Unfortunately, a small leak developed which was fixed immediately.

On May 7, a template was lasered for the countertops. The technician took our sinks which include lots of workable extras. Flooring was next and installed in one day by Mike, Matt, and Hailey from NW Trends. Just beautiful and complimentary with the cabinetry. Lee Ely slipped in on a Sat and installed the wire shelving in the pantry. We then had a week of down time as countertops were crafted. Our custom countertops *actually arrived early* on May 17 and were perfectly installed by Ken & Tristin of NW Trends – *wondrous!* The new sinks were also installed with all the extra drain & cutting boards, sink guards, vegetable washing/scrap bin.

# **Space for Grace**

I love the time in our service where we share the Peace of the Lord with one another. Foremost, the Peace is Jesus. When we say, "Peace be with you" to one another we are in essence saying, "Jesus be with you." We are taking time to extend grace to one another, and that grace is Jesus. We also take a few moments to greet one another, check in, give a hug or handshake, which is also a means of blessing one another.

I also love the time leading into Holy Communion as the words of institution are spoken or sung over the bread and wine, and in faith we prepare to receive Christ and His promise of the forgiveness of sins. St. Paul reminds us that as often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim His death until He comes (1 Corinthians 11:26). It is a time of seriously great joy. It is a time to reflect and, as St. Paul encourages the church, to examine ourselves as Christ extends His amazing grace toward us again and again each Sunday.

Starting in June, I propose to give each of these beloved practices of grace their 'space' in the service so each can be more fully expressed. The Sharing of the Peace will take place toward the beginning of our worship. The revised order will be:

Call to Worship Welcome/Announcements Confession and Forgiveness Sharing the Peace Songs Prayer of the Day

After the Prayer of the Day the service continues as it typically has with readings, the message, creed, prayers, communion, and so forth.

I look forward to this simple but significant change which affords us space for grace, as we more fully enter into sharing God's peace and receiving Christ's body and blood in what I pray will be even more meaningful ways. – Pastor Jon



He prepares a place for us and will come again (<u>John 14:3</u>). He welcomes us to paradise with Him (<u>Luke 23:43</u>). We are His (<u>1 John 3:1</u>).

In this month which elevates and celebrates sin as virtue (Proverbs 16:18, 21:4, <u>1 Peter 5:5</u>), and exchanges the God of creation for the "god" of self (<u>Romans 1:21-25</u>), let us humbly remember Jesus: what He has done, continues to do, and will yet do. He acts out of mercy, in perfect justice, for us, who are unworthy, who cannot work to earn His grace or gift of salvation. In love, He offers it anyway (<u>Romans 5:8</u>). Let us be not ashamed to boldly share Him, remembering that it is not our works that merit any honor, but only Jesus (<u>2 Timothy 1:8-9</u>). For, "A person is no fool who gives up what he can't keep [mortal life] to receive what he can't lose [eternal life and fellowship with Jesus]" (quote by Jim Elliot).
