Care for the Soul

Care for our souls has been neglected in our culture. I spend plenty of time and money caring for my body (diet and exercise, doctors' visits to get my blood pressure under control:-/). We invest in our intellect with education. We take care of relationships (I'm waiting for a friend right now to have coffee as I write this). But our soul... My friends and I have been studying the Psalms this summer and Psalm 103 is my new favorite. It begins and ends with this phrase; "Bless the LORD, O my soul". To "bless" is also translated "praise". When I bless/praise the LORD it is for my sake. God is just fine with his self-concept. He doesn't need me to prop Him up. As I praise Him, I give God my whole focus, my affection, thanks and affirmation. As I do this my world gets much, much bigger.

Whatever I "praise/bless", I give my full attention to. Recently I went in ½ on the cost of an RV trailer with some friends. Now I find myself giving my attention to RVs, talking with fellow RV owners, trying to figure out how to fix stuff. Its where my focus goes. When things go well with my Winnebago Micro Minnie Trailer things are good with me. When the battery goes down, it's not as fun. Where my focus is, where my money is invested, where my time is spent, those are the things I am "blessing/praising".

So back to the soul. The Hebrew word for soul is nephesh. "And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living **soul**" (Genesis 2:7). In the New Testament, the word used is psyche. "For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own **soul**" (Mark 8:36)

There are some practical ways that Christians for centuries have been listening to the Lord and learning how to care for their souls. Slowing down as you read the Scriptures is a good start. I encourage you to read Psalm 103. Focus especially on verses 1-5. Take your time. Perhaps read it through several times. First time through just get a sense of what it says. Second time through notice if there is a word or phrase that kind of jumps off the page to you. Third time through ask the Lord what you should do with this word or phrase. Then, bless the Lord -that is, give thanks, praise for his specific benefits to your soul these days. For some, it helps to write down prayers (journal) to get your thoughts and prayers down on paper. Final step, share your discoveries with a trusted friend (over coffee is nice).

I very much look forward to my time with you all in September as we share together more ideas on caring for the soul and how we can love the Lord with all our hearts, minds, strength/bodies and... our soul.

Devotion and Prayer: Catherine Rangel, "Decision Making"

Attendance: Dave Pollard, Ken Birge, Tom Robison, Catherine McClintick, Tom Carlson, Chris Clark, Marge Freligh, Catherine Rangel, and Pastor Jon. Absent, Connie Arthur.

Minutes: The July 12, 2022, council meeting minutes were reviewed. <u>Ken Birge made a motion to accept the minutes as presented</u>. Seconded by Tom Carlson. **Motion approved**.

Treasurer's Report: Tom Robison reported that we are in excellent standing. Monthly and YTD giving exceeds expenses, yet we are cautious as some expenses have not come up yet. It is noted that \$400 of the \$500 expense for VBS came from a donor who came into the church one day.

Marge F. made a motion to accept the financial reports as presented. Seconded by Catherine R. **Motion approved**.

President's Report:

- President Dave Pollard reported that **Champ's Heart** is on the list as August's benevolence outreach. <u>Catherine McClintick made a motion to approve, seconded by Tom Carlson</u>. **Motion approved**
- President Dave will give a "What's Happening" report on Sunday, August 28, to the congregation
- President Dave suggested the church survey results should be in the minutes; Tom Robison handed out results of the survey.

Ministry Team Reports:

Tom Robison suggested that the ministries should put forth a "wish list" for needs within each ministry. Fellowship: No meeting last month, no report.

<u>Mission & Outreach/Vision:</u> Tom R mentioned this is Family Promise month and includes three adults & six children. Property & Maintenance: See report presented by Ken Birge.

Safety Team: Tom C will be attending their meeting on August 11, there will be a discussion about the cameras.

Strategic Planning: Ken B had council look at their Strategic Planning diagram, Foreground Vision for 90 Days, the Refresh Website can be moved to the *Ta-Da* list, and be replaced with something from the *Parking Lot*, Additional Worship; not moving, Leadership Development Plan; not moving, Master Site Plan; should have it noted as a yearly review – it may not need to stay in the 90 Day position. Review/Revise – remind everybody on the teams at the end of the year to make necessary changes for the next council; remain in the 90 Day slot. Pastor Jon asked to table the Measures & Marks list until all the council has the complete form.

<u>Stewardship:</u> Chris Clark gave an endowment report; he has a few contacts willing to discuss anything we would like to discuss. Contacts have given info about setup costs. We have information about two endowment companies that can facilitate our needs when needed – INNOVIA Foundation and Idaho Community Foundation Endowment Companies.

<u>Youth and Education:</u> Catherine R reported that new books came in and she has made a few lessons to try out for KidZone. She also reported about Operation Christmas Child – she will attend a meeting on Sep 10 – we need to set up a church team of volunteers.

Worship & Music: Marge F reported that this team is thinking about two services.

Unfinished Business: Tom R reviewed the survey results with the council; the results will be shared with the congregation on 8/28 after church in fellowship hall with time for questions and answers. We need to address the people who do not support two services. Council needs to make recommendations to the congregation. There will be a special congregational meeting on September 11 to take a vote.

New Business: Marge Freligh moved to share survey results with the congregation on August 28, then on September 11, recommending we vote as to go to two services at 8:30 AM and 10:30 AM. Tom Carlson seconded. **Motion Approved.**

We want to share this beautiful letter from Paul Hunter about NGM and the Uganda Mission:

Dear friend of NGM!

What an amazing mission Pam & I enjoyed with seven others in the nation of Uganda recently! Among those missionaries were Doug Steiner, NGM Board Chairman, and Skip Gipson who recently joined the board as a member.

The three weeks I spent in Uganda was very important for me for several reasons ... both on a personal level as well as for NGM. I want to share them with you.

1. Transition - While we were in Uganda, Doug, Pam, and I met with the Ugandan Board of Directors and had a marvelous and beneficial meeting together. We are in unity with the direction of the organization. During the time Doug was in Jinja we had a combined dinner with the NGM staff, the UG Board of Directors, the short-term missionaries, and Sylvia Subo. Doug officially handed over the supervision of NGM to the Uganda Board of Directors.

It was an evening of praise and celebration for what God has done over the years. I believe that we are leaving the work of God in good hands with both the Board of Directors and the NGM Staff.

Pam shared with the group that our time there may well be our last visit to the nation we love so much. She wanted everyone to know that we leave Uganda with a sweet taste in our mouths. We know of many foreign missionaries who have been betrayed, deceived, and misused and have left the nation with bitterness and an oath to never return. Not so with Pam and me. After nearly 20 years, we leave Uganda with a greater love for the people than with which we came, great satisfaction with the Board and Staff, and gratitude for all the Lord has done in our time leading the organization. We would be delighted to have the Lord ask us to return.

2. Gratitude - Sylvia Subo's last day as an employee with NGM was June 15, 2022. While I am sad to see her go, I believe that her service to the organization as NGM Administrator was timed by the Lord. He brought her to NGM at just the right time. Her contribution to the organization was huge as she brought her organizational skills, structures and systems, and compliance with the laws of Uganda to NGM at the perfect time. She was God's gift to us and I am forever grateful. On

behalf of the International Board of Directors, I thank Sylvia for the gift she was from God during the time that the organization needed her strengths. We all wish her well in her next endeavor for the sake of Christ.

3. Vision - My visit to Uganda was so motivating. The Spirit of God stirred my heart to see that NGM must not settle for a maintenance mode or to rest on past accomplishments. No. It is time to move forward. The staff is embracing a new culture as they seek to work as a team rather than function with a pyramid system of leadership. The Board of Directors has given the position of Team Leader to Esther Mulungi as an Intern for 12 months. They gave me the assignment of mentoring her during those months. Esther is working hard to lead that team to function as a team.

My recent short-term mission, which ended with a medical mission in Western Uganda, underscored the need for NGM to expand to other parts of the nation as we love people on behalf of God and seek to change Uganda one person at a time. Rebecca Hunter organized, facilitated, assembled a team, and led the medical mission. It was an astounding success. Rebecca is a product of the work of NGM and I discovered she has been mentoring many of her fellow medical students as well as a musical shop owner and a boda boda man and others I don't know about! Discipleship/mentoring is what NGM is all about as relationships are our foundation. Rebecca is carrying that vision to her peers and colleagues.

Additionally, Rebecca has informed me to approach the Board of Directors with her desire to be the very first sent-out missionary for NGM. She has big dreams as indicated by the CBO she registered with the nation of Uganda called **SOZO Dream Foundation - Saved, Healed, Made Whole.**

4. Partnership - We need you to be a part of Team NGM more than ever. We want to have a wider impact and we need you to consider going to Uganda as a short-term missionary, to contribute financially to the many needs of the organization, and to pray for God's blessing and favor as He directs the work of Next Generation Ministries.

The blind man by the side of the road, the tax collector up a tree, a long-ill woman in the midst of a crowd, a demon-possessed man in the tombs. Jesus engages people personally, yet not privately. He comes and extends the kingdom of heaven into the dailiness of our lives... meeting us where we are... but refusing to leave us there. More details coming soon!



I recently went for a hike in an area I had not previously explored. I knew where the trail started, about how long it was and to look for large boulders, which would signify the hike was almost complete.

A hiking buddy had maps and statistics of the trail and gave periodic updates. "We have gone 1 mile and climbed 200 feet, only 4 more miles and 586 feet elevation gain to go!" This information was helpful, but, for me, it was also a little distracting. Sometimes even discouraging. We had only gone 1 mile and had 4 more to go?! I felt the pull to shift into "survival" mode: head down, feet moving, no conversation, just chugging along with a blinding determination. This pulled me away from experiencing the joys of the moment, instead imagining large boulders and the end of the trail around every bend.

Sometimes the trail was steep, dusty, hot, with pests swarming in the muggy air and hiding amidst the tall weeds. Sometimes the trail was tranquil, shaded and cool, bending with the curves of a creek featuring melodious bullfrogs, sweet-smelling cedar and lush vegetation. If I focused solely on finishing the race, I would miss seeing Him in these moments. I would miss reveling in the majesty and goodness of God. On the parts of the journey where I struggled, God was with me. On the parts where I enjoyed rest, God was with me. This is true in every trial and time and on every trail, throughout life.

God is with us (Joshua 1:5, 9). Jesus, our Lord and Savior, is with us, holding us close and granting us peace (Matthew 28:20, Psalm 27:10 and 118:6-7). We are led by the Spirit and we are His (Psalm 94:14, Romans 8:14, 1 Peter 2:9). God gives us daily bread, supplies for all of our needs and places us in this time purposely (Matthew 6:11, 26, Philippians 4:19, Esther 4:14).

In the beginning, if I had accurately grasped how steep the trail was, I might not have started on it. Has that ever been true for you? Have you ever reflected upon where you are now and seen the gracious way God leads and provides? How He lovingly gives courage, purpose and peace? God grows our skills and challenges us to deepen our reliance upon Him, to keep trusting Him and walking in His will and love, always. – Karen Robison

A Lively Discussion!

On Sunday, Aug 28, a productive and lively discussion was held during fellowship time hashing out the results and details of the two-service worship survey that we filled out and expressed opinions.
