

Our Father who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name.



Jesus teaches His disciples how to pray by praying. And the opening lines of what we now call the Lord's Prayer are shocking. First of all, we have Jesus showing us that the One to whom we pray is not some far-off deity, but God who desires relationship with us. Jesus reveals the Father who is determined for us to be His daughters and sons. Yes, He is Almighty, Everlasting, Sovereign, Creator of all things seen and unseen. Yes, His thoughts are higher than our thoughts, His ways higher than our ways... and yet, His thoughts are upon us, and His ways involve demonstrating His love toward us.

When we pray, Jesus tells us, we are made aware of the relationship God intends to have with us. This is a conversation between a father and his children. A father who is love, joy, and peace. A father who is patient, kind, and good. A father who is faithful, gentle, and self-controlled (Galatians 5:22-23). And this, Our Father who is in heaven, has freely given us all things in Christ (Romans 8:32); has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly realms (Ephesians 1:3). This is a Father who is for us, not against us and from whose love we are inseparable in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:39).

Which then leads us to the second half of this first petition: Hallowed be Your name. His name is not hallowed because we observe it as such, but because Our heavenly is Hallowed: beyond, set apart, from all other relationship we could imagine – a relationship He has initiated from before the foundations of the world (Ephesians 1:4). We speak this truth as we address Our Father, for our sakes, for our remembrance of how He alone is able as well as willing to overcome all the things we encounter in this world. We are also reminded that we, as His children, are called name and are called to take His name not only upon our lips, but upon our lives. God has bestowed His name upon us.

And, Jesus shows us in this opening petition, that it is WE not me alone. Our Father, we are His children we are beloved and belong to God. AND, as sons and daughters of God we are brothers and sisters, one with another: beloved of God and belonging to God as well as one another. We come to the Father as family and every petition that follows is revelation of just what God intends to bestow upon His family. The Psalms are full of this realization that God makes us His own and makes us part of His family.


> It is He who has made us, and not we ourselves; We are His people and the sheep of His pasture. Psalm 100:3

"He received 39 stripes because 40 was known to kill a man. They wanted him alive. They held handfuls of his beard, and hair and pulled it out by the roots. They wanted him alive. They kicked, punched, and spit on him for hours. Until there wasn't a single spot on his body not covered in blood. They wanted him alive. They shoved a crown of thorns down on his head so harshly it stuck in his skin. They wanted him alive. After hours of being beaten, mocked, whipped, flogged, and tortured they made him walk with a cross. They made him carry it. A rough piece of wood with splinters digging into fresh wounds. They wanted him alive. They wanted him to feel every ounce of pain they could bring. He had to feel it in order to heal us.

Crucifixion was historically one of the cruelest, most tortured deaths a human could face. Hours upon hours of torture. Torture most of us cannot mentally think of because the cruelty isn't normal. It isn't something our minds can comprehend. We celebrate Easter with pastel colors, happy

children hunting eggs, and chocolate. Truth is there was absolutely nothing happy about the day Jesus died. It was cruel, bloody, and nasty.

He could have stopped all of it. He could have called every angel in heaven to demolish every person standing and shouting, "Crucify Him!" He didn't. He knew in order to have a Sunday you have to have a Friday. He knew in order to have joy you have to carry your cross.

He felt everything that day. He felt how your heart broke wide open when you had to watch your baby die. He felt how heavy your life was when you were staring down the barrel of a gun wondering if the man you called husband was going to shoot you. He carried the weight of the burden you have felt since your spouse died, and life just doesn't seem right since. On that cross he held the rapist and murderers, the sinner, and the saint. He leveled every playing field and said ALL of you are worth it. He knew he had to carry the cross. He never promised the cross you carry in this life would not be heavy. His wasn't. His promise is that Sunday is coming.

No matter how heavy Friday is. Financially, emotionally, mentally, or physically. Friday is heavy. That cross is weighing you down and you are about to crumble under its weight. His promise was simply this. He won't make you carry it alone. What kind of king would step down from his throne for this?

Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God did. For you.

He did every bit of it for you and me. Oh yes, it is heavy. So heavy sometimes you do not think you can take one more step. But look up, because Sunday is coming." – Rich Walters

The Role of the Word

Since Advent, we have been thinking about Jesus as "the Word [who] became flesh and dwelt among us (John 1:14). In 2 Timothy3:16-17, Paul describes all Scripture as being "breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." Jesus, the mouth of God, the embodiment of the Word, speaks to us through the pages of the Bible in ways that are profitable for teaching, reproof, correcting and training in righteousness.

So...what does this mean? What do the Scriptures...do? Scripture teaches us doctrine, developing our mind, morals and worldview. They comfort us, showing us our Creator God, the hope we have in our Savior. The Scripture reveals our sin nature and sinfulness, detailing why we need saving. They reprove us, showing us our moral failures, our fickle hearts and our feeble nature, all leading us to turn to the Lord for strength and salvation. (Psalm 19:7-8, 119:9, 1 Corinthians 10:11–12, Hebrews 4:12-13, 2Peter 1:19). His Word comforts us, encourages us and equips us. He reveals who He is, what He has done, and what He will do, in His Word.

God uses His Word and His Spirit to sanctify us. Sometimes that means correction. Before you have the image of a teacher hovering over your homework with a bright red pen, let's examine the Greek. The word Paul uses in 2 Timothy is "epanórthōsis." Notice the middle part of the word: "orthos". The root word for orthopedics and orthodontic work, it carries the idea of straightening up, helping to be true and correct. It is a healing word. That is what the Word of God does. It straightens what has been bent out of shape. It corrects and aligns, for our benefit, health, and wellbeing. The adjective "profitable" too is a word that emphasizes how good the Bible is for us, indicating how it is beneficial, specifically promoting and enhancing overall well-being.

Scripture is the primary way God grows His children, whom He so loves. Scripture is how He reveals Himself to us. We learn about our Creator God through His Word. God's Spirit leads God's children to grow and submit to the Word of God. His Word and Spirit works in our lives to bring healing and transformation. It brings correction where things have gone wrong, caring for our whole well-being and always directing us to Him, to our Savior, the "Word made flesh". As you read the Word with a prayerful heart, seek to know more about God, to see more of Jesus, to be taught and corrected by Him as He works in and through you, equipping and encouraging you for His good works.

Lent, Holy Week & Easter




